# School Buildings

The Victorian School Building Authority, architects – Clarke Hopkins Clarke, Project Managers – Tango and our builders – Plan Group have commenced fortnightly meetings regarding the commencement of our new build.

The builders will commence preliminary works from **Monday 4th March**. From this date, the staff carpark will be the new site enclosure/office. Staff will be parking in the back carpark throughout the duration of the build. The front gate adjacent to the carpark will be closed from this date, along with the gate on Sheldon Ave (opposite Vans). The entry from Nelson St will be from the gate near the Year 1/2 playground. The gate near the year 1 classrooms will be the entry from Sheldon Ave.

The preliminary ground works will take place through to early May. This is when we will see the current art room demolished. We look forward to sharing the journey with photos throughout the 2 years of the build.

# SUNSMART HATS IN TERM ONE



All students are required to wear a hat when out in the yard at school during Term 1. Children who do not wear a hat will be asked to play under shade sails (outside the Yr 2 classrooms), away from the sun. We also advise students to wear SPF30+ sunscreen to school.

# YARD SUPERVISION

Under DET guidelines, the school provides supervision in the yard 10 minutes before the official start of school and 10 minutes after the completion of classes for students at the end of the day. To this effect, there are staff members on yard duty from **8.40am** each morning and 3:20pm following classes. Students are to enter classrooms at 8.40am. This means that no children are allowed to be on playground equipment before 8:35am and after **3:35pm** as there is no formal supervision of students. I ask that parents support the school by ensuring that you speak to your children in relation to this.

### Mobile Phones in Schools

A reminder that the Department of Education has in place a mobile phone ban that requires students who bring mobiles phones to school to have them switched off and securely put away during school hours.

The department is requiring all schools to ensure this ban is in place and enforced from the start of the 2024 school year.

The ban applies equally to all government schools right across the state.

This helps ensure that school is a learning environment free from unnecessary distractions and disruptions.

By ensuring mobile phones are kept away at recess and lunch times, students can interact with each other face-to-face, without the distractions and social pressures that mobile phones can cause

I ask for the support of all our families, staff and students in continuing to support the implementation of this policy in our school.


**Exceptions:** For a small number of students with <u>particular health</u> needs, an exception to the policy may be granted. Please contact the office if you would like to discuss this.


**Emergencies:** In the event of an emergency or if you need to immediately contact your child, I ask that families contact the school office who will pass on a message as required.

# **CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSION FUND**

Every Victoria Child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors. Excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works while sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are a part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card, such as a Veterans Affairs Gold Card, Centrelink Health Care Card or Pensioner Concession Card, or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance (for eligible primary school students) of \$150 is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions and sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

#### How to apply:

New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download the form from https://www.education.vic.gov.au/about/programs/Pages/csef.aspx If you applied for CSEF through our school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year, unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

# You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- New student enrolments; your child has started or changed schools this year
- Changed family circumstances; such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing this year

Check with the school office if you are unsure, and please return completed forms to the school office as soon as possible.

# **CONVEYANCING ALLOWANCE**







Families of students attending a government or non-government school in rural/regional Victoria may be eligible for financial assistance to help them meet the cost of transporting children to and from school.

The financial assistance - known as a conveyance allowance- is designed for students who can't access free school buses, and helps cover the cost of public transport, private car and private bus.

To be eligible for a conveyance allowance, students must be of school age and:

- · reside 4.8km or more by the shortest practicable route from home to school and;
- live in rural and regional Victoria and attend their nearest appropriate school. They conveyance allowance is paid by the Department of Education and Training to

If you think your child may qualify for a conveyance allowance, please contact the school to discuss eligibility, and for further information on the application process and payment amounts.
