FREE INSTRUCTION

- Schools provide students with free instruction and ensure students have free access to all items, activities and services that are used by the school to fulfil the standard curriculum requirements in Victorian Curriculum F-10, VCE and VCAL.
- Schools may invite parents to make a financial contribution to support the school.

PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS

Schools can request contributions from parents under three categories:



Curriculum Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for curriculum items and activities which the school deems necessary for students to learn the Curriculum.

Other Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for non-curriculum items and activities that relate to the school's functions and objectives.

Extra-Curricular Items and Activities

Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides for free to deliver the Curriculum. These are provided on a user-pays basis.

 Schools may also invite parents to supply or purchase educational items to use and own (e.g. textbooks, stationery, digital devices).



FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES

- Schools put in place financial hardship arrangements to support families who cannot pay for items or activities so that their child doesn't miss out.
- Schools have a nominated parent payment contact person(s) that parents can have a confidential discussion with regarding financial hardship arrangements.



SCHOOL PROCESSES

Parent Payments Policy – 2022 Information for Families

Darley Primary School is looking forward to another great year of teaching and learning and would like to advise you of Darley Primary Schools' voluntary contributions for 2022.

With all the new changes to the Parent Payment Policy for 2022, we will send out paper copies of curriculum contribution details, along with stationery lists for each year level, and instructions on how to order from the Winc online portal.

PLEASE NOTE: Curriculum contribution payments can be made from February 2022. New coding comes into effect in 2022 so we cannot accept any payments until then.

All details will also be posted to our website and on Compass in case you misplace your paper copies.

As all Parent contributions are voluntary, we cannot set up a payment plan on Compass as we have in previous years. We will however place the details on Compass under Course Confirmation and Payments, as a payment option for you.

You can also pay using Bpay, Centrelink or EFTPOS at the school.

Bpay details will be provided to all families at the start of Term 1 2022. Families can choose to set up their own payment plan using Bpay.

Another change for 2022 is that we cannot invoice you for any Curriculum contribution payments in advance, we can only receipt funds when they are received. It will be very important that you keep all receipts for payments to refer back to as we won't be sending out family statements.

Delivery Fees:

Free delivery for orders placed on or before 1st December 2021.

\$12.95 delivery: for orders placed after 1st December 2021.

Orders Placed:

On or before 31st December 2021 will be delivered before the start of Term 1 2022.

Please note for orders placed after 31st December 2021, we cannot guarantee delivery prior to the start of Term1.

Orders can be delivered to your home or work address, NOT to PO boxes or the school.

If you do purchase a stationery pack for your child/children please bring the pack in its entirety to school on the first day back, which is Monday 31st January 2022.





Education and Training

The Department of Education and Training has made changes to the Parent Payments Policy for 2022, and these changes are outlined below.

General statement

- The Department of Education and Training has sought to clarify the Parent Payments Policy for 2022 to remove any ambiguity relating to parents' financial contributions to schools.
- Changes to how schools request contributions have been made accordingly.

Why are parent payment arrangements different now?

- The Department of Education and Training reviewed parent contribution practices across a significant number of schools last year and found some inconsistency in the way contributions were being requested and managed.
- In recognition of this, the Department has now made changes to how schools seek
 contributions to align practices across the system and ensure consistency. The intent is to
 ensure parents and schools use common terminology and have a shared understanding
 around parent payment arrangements.

What is specifically different?

Parent Payment Categories

- The categories under which contributions will be requested have been changed to align with the purpose of the payment:
 - Curriculum Contributions (previously known as Essential Student Learning Items) support items and activities that help deliver fundamental curriculum or subject learning e.g. General classroom materials and equipment
 - Other Contributions (previously known as Voluntary Contributions) support the school's operation and function more generally e.g. Parent communication tools and school building enhancements
 - o Payments for Extra-Curricular Items and Activities (previously known as Optional Items) provide for items and activities over and above what is needed to deliver fundamental curriculum learning. These *user-pays* contributions enhance the schooling experience for students e.g. Optional camps, excursions and events

A new template for communicating arrangements

A new template is being used by all schools to communicate parent payment arrangements. The template includes the new category names to clearly define the purpose of parent payment requests and includes a one-page overview of the policy.

New payment procedures

- Internal invoicing and receipt practices have also changed in relation to the way contributions are processed. Schools will no longer send out invoices and statements for Curriculum and Other Contributions.
- Parents simply view contribution requests at the beginning of the year, then make their contributions using the payment methods provided. Parents may wish to use Bpay, Centre Pay or Compass to manage the payment process.

- Receipts must be issued to families for the contributions that they make directly to the school office. Relevant receipts will be issued for tax deductible donations in compliance with ATO regulations.
- Invoices and statements may be received by parents for Extra-Curricular Items and Activities. These are often confirmed throughout the year for camps, excursions, special events and other activities or items.

Communicating the voluntary nature and importance of contributions

- Curriculum and Other contributions are voluntary.
- We continue to value your contributions in supporting our school's programs and resources.
- Your contributions continue to assist us to broaden the educational experience for our students. It has allowed us to provide iPad upgrades and the Nurture Program.
- Without your contributions, many of these things may not be possible.
- If you are unable or choose not to make financial contributions, your child will not be disadvantaged or denied access to the resources required to deliver the curriculum. We will always provide students with free instruction to fulfil the standard Victorian curriculum.
- For Extra-Curricular Items and Activities, it is up to you whether you wish for your child
 to have the item/participate in the activity.
- These are optional and provided on a user-pays basis, and so the school will require a parent payment to provide them to individual students.
- For some educational items (e.g., devices, stationery, textbooks), it makes sense for
 parents to purchase them from a third-party provider, so students can take personal
 ownership for use at school and/or at home. The school considers the necessity of these
 items, the cost and preferred suppliers. The school has pre-negotiated discount prices for
 stationery packs through an online portal with WINC, our preferred stationery supplier.
 Details of how to order are attached to this letter.
- Our school only requests contributions for items that we believe add value to the school experience for students.
- The contributions go specifically towards items and activities that help improve your child's educational experience.

Schools provide students with free instruction to fulfil the standard Victorian curriculum and we want to assure you that all contributions are voluntary. Nevertheless, the ongoing support of our families ensures that our school can offer the best possible education and support for our students.
